New Minimum Standards Criteria

The newly adopted Minimum Standards Criteria took effect January 1, 2021. Now, all renewing institutions are required to maintain compliance with the new *Minimum Standards Criteria*. Reduced Application Requirements

There has been a reduction in the number of required exhibits in both the Initial and Renewal of Authorization applications. The change will be reflected in all applications started as of February 26, 2021.

FY22 Legislative Changes

HB 152 was signed by Governor Kemp on May 6, 2021 and makes the following changes effective July 1, 2021:

- 1. Exempts from authorization institutions whose campuses are located on a military installation, even if members of the public attend said institutions.
- 2. Corrects an error caused by the 2015 update to O.C.G.A. § 20-3-250.3(a) concerning which schools were required to send audits to NPEC.
- 3. Allows the agency to conduct the annual site visit virtually for certain, qualifying institutions, as determined by the executive director. Prior to the effective date of July 1, 2021, Georgia code requires all site visits to be conducted in-person annually. GNPEC is currently in the process of revising the site visit procedures as a result of the legislative change and will make the applicable announcement in July.
- 4. Clarifies that if a bond is in force at the time of institutional closure, the surety will be required to remit the full-face value of the bond to NPEC. This language revision is necessary to ensure timely surrender of bonds at the time of precipitous closures.


Increases bond amounts for institutions earning over \$1 million in tuition annually to better mitigate the financial burdens for students involved in a potential closure. Increased bond amounts only apply to institutions that become initially authorized after July 1, 2021, or any currently authorized institutions that change ownership after July 1, 2021.

Clarifies the original intent of the law related to bond requirements in that the requirement renews following an ownership change of an authorized institution.

Reminders

Requirement of SOS Documentation

For any initial and renewal applicant that enrolls Georgia students, both the institution's most recently filed *Georgia Secretary of State issued Certificate of Authority* and the *Annual Registration* are required to be uploaded in tab 1 of the Initial Authorization and Renewal of Authorization applications under the "Ownership" Section. Online Modality Shift

Please be advised that GNPEC has extended the deadline for online modality shift approval to the date that the federally declared emergency ends, which will align with the deadline set by the United States Department of Education (ED) to allow for continued online delivery of programs previously only approved by GNPEC for in-person instruction.

If you choose to continue to offer online instruction, no action needs to be taken at this time. Once an extended deadline has been determined by the ED, the agency will reassess the circumstances and notify all institutions of its decision regarding the deadline and what actions must be then taken.
