Please be reminded that complete Renewal of Authorization application and fees are due in office by your institution's **application due date**, which is 60 days prior to the institution's expiration date. Submission of EDvera application or receipt of all required fees after the institution's expiration date will result in the assessment of a 25% late fee on all applicable fees.

Application Documentation Reminder

Please use the Minimum Standards Checklist and GNPEC Financial Statement that is in the EDvera applications at the time of completion. Do not use previous years versions as updates and revisions are made, and the versions in the EDvera applications are the most up to date.

Revised Financial Statement

Please note that the GNPEC Financial Statement in EDvera has been updated with improvements, including the addition of the instructions within the Financial Statement spreadsheet.

Policies

Student Outcome Data
